Homework. Why Do Teachers Assign Homework? Teachers assign homework for many reasons. Homework can help their students review and practice what they've covered in class; get ready for the next day's class; learn to use resources, such as libraries, reference materials and computer Web sites to find information about a subject; explore subjects more fully than classroom time permits; extend learning by applying skills they already have to new situations; and integrate their learning by applying many different skills to a single task, such as book reports or science projects.

Homework can also help students to develop good study habits and positive attitudes. It can teach them to work independently; and it encourages self-discipline and responsibility.

In addition, homework can help create greater understanding between families and teachers and provide opportunities for increased communication. Monitoring homework keeps families informed about what their children are learning and about the policies and programs of the teacher and the school.

Does Homework Help Children Learn? In the early grades, homework can help children to develop good study habits and positive attitudes. From third through sixth grades, homework, gradually increased each year, may support improved school achievement. In seventh grade and beyond, students who complete more homework score better on standardized tests and earn better grades, on the average, than do students who do less homework. The difference in test scores and grades between students who do more homework and those who do less increases as students move up through the grades.

Homework is a great opportunity for spending time with your child. Not doing the HW for them, but giving support, being available if assistance is needed.

Quality time and homework can beautifully go hand in hand .
