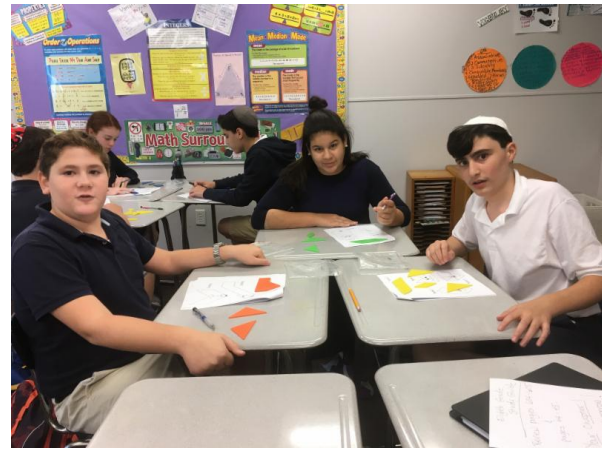
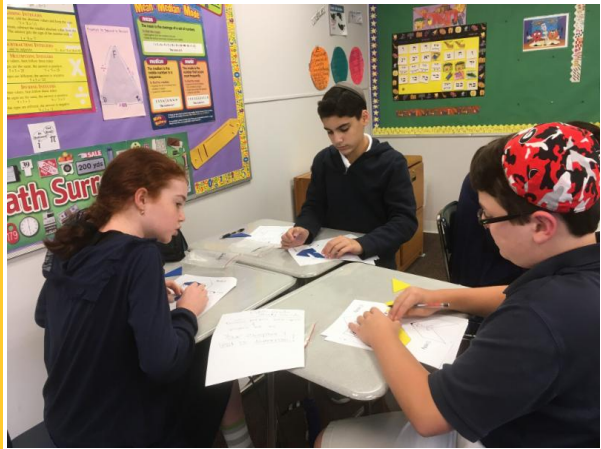
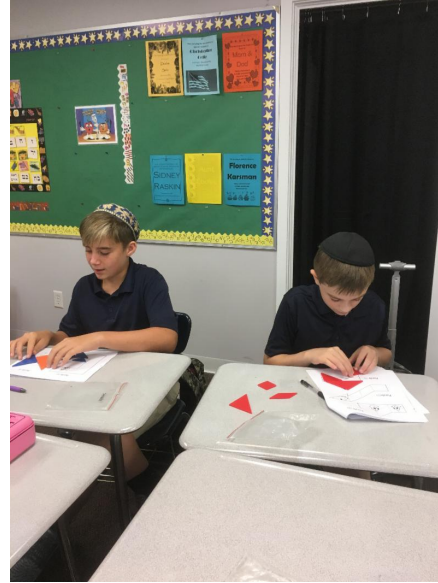
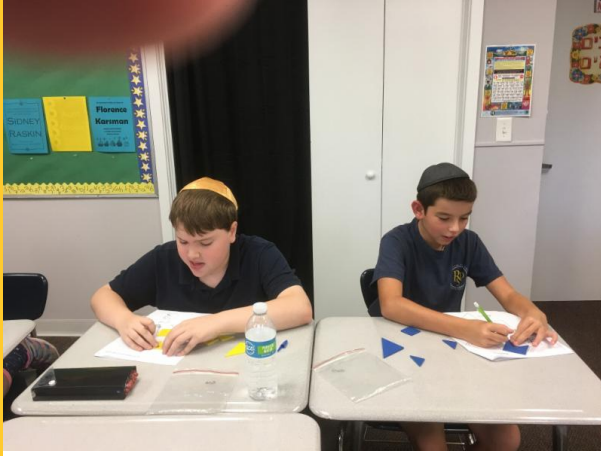
SEVENTH GRADE YAHADUS

6th - 8th Grade Math classes joined forces to solve Tangram puzzles using geometric shapes.

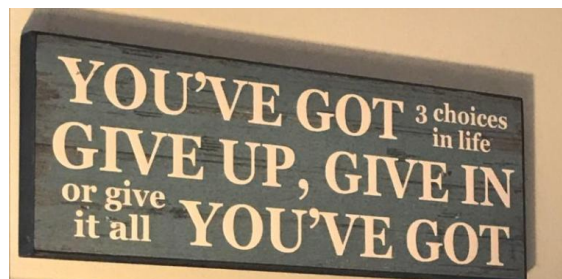


EIGHTH GRADE YAHADUS/BETTER TOGETHER PROGRAM

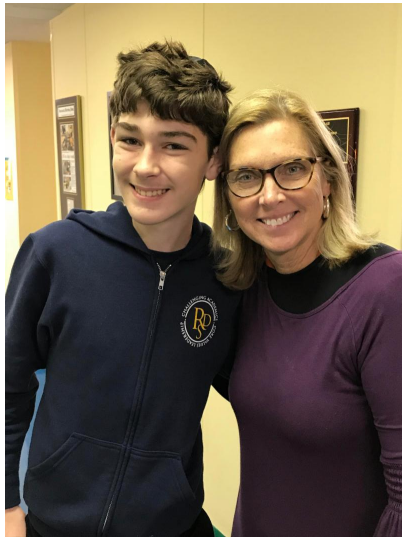




SEVENTH GRADE YAHADUS HAKARAS HATOV - APPRECIATION

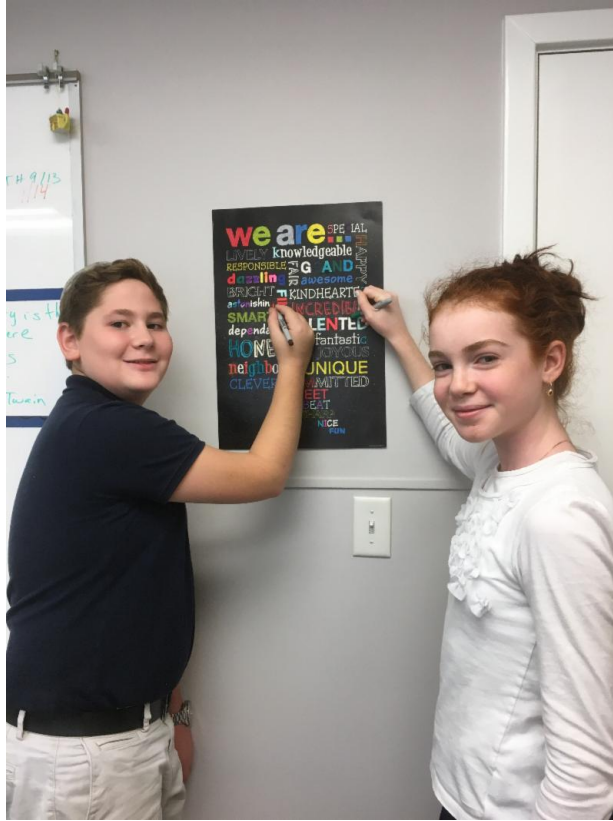
When was the last time you said thank you to your teacher? Teachers have probably the biggest impact on one's life, and most of us may have never properly thanked them!
